# Seasonal Bird Care: Preparing for Our Feathered Neighbors

As the seasons change in Fort Worth, it's important to prepare for our feathered neighbors to ensure they thrive year-round.

## HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP:

### 1. Provide Food Sources:

**Fall and Winter:** Stock up on high-energy foods like black-oil sunflower seeds, suet, and peanuts to help birds build up fat reserves for colder months.

**Spring and Summer:** Offer nectar feeders for hummingbirds, and provide seeds and suet for other birds. Native plants that produce berries, seeds, or nectar are also great natural food sources.

### 2. Maintain Birdbaths:

**Year-Round:** Clean and refill birdbaths regularly to provide a fresh water source. In winter, consider adding a heater to keep the water from freezing.

### 3. Shelter and Nesting Sites:

**Fall:** Clean out old nests from birdhouses to prepare for the next breeding season. Plant

evergreen trees or shrubs to offer shelter during cold weather.

**Spring:** Put up nesting boxes or birdhouses to attract species like bluebirds, chickadees, and wrens.

### 4. Create a Bird-Friendly Garden:

Plant native shrubs, trees, and flowers that provide food and shelter. Layered vegetation, including ground covers, bushes, and trees, offers various birds places to hide and nest.

Leave some garden areas a bit "wild," with leaf litter and brush piles, which can be a great habitat for ground-feeding birds and insects they may eat.

### 5. Protect Birds from Hazards:

**Windows:** Use window decals or screens to prevent bird collisions.

**Cats:** Keep cats indoors or supervise them outdoors to prevent them from hunting birds.

### 6. Participate in Bird Counts:

Join local or national bird counts to help track bird populations and contribute to conservation efforts. Events like the **Great Backyard Bird Count** ([www.birdcount.org](http://www.birdcount.org)) are a great way to get involved.

By taking these steps, you'll help support and protect the diverse bird species that call the DFW metroplex and northeast Texas home throughout the year.



# Create A 100% Edible Fall Planter

The autumn season is upon us, and it's time to spruce up the planters on your front porch or maybe introduce some welcoming greenery to a bare space.

I'm always on the lookout for ways to add more productive plants to my home, so I love creating planters that not only look festive and pretty but also grow things I can eat. As the summer winds down, I'm excited to refresh my planters with new growth for the fall.

Keep reading for tips on how to fill your own planter with edible plants for the fall season. If you follow my recommendations below, you'll have a planter that's 100 percent edible and a bright, cheerful sight to welcome you home as the days grow shorter.

## 3 Easy Steps to Create Your Fall Planter

### STEP ONE: Prepare Your Planter

Make sure you're using a planter that has drainage holes at the bottom. The edible plants I'll recommend below don't like having wet feet (when their roots are sitting in water).

Fill your planter with a nutrient-rich organic potting soil.

If you need to refresh a planter from a previous season, remove any dead plants and debris so that you can start fresh for the new season. Add some compost to the top of the soil. You might want to grab another container that you can fill with some of the soil you'll

need to take out of the planter to make room for all of the new plants. If you end up with soil left over, you can always top off other potted plants.

### STEP TWO: Buy Plants for Your Fall Planter

Use my plant recommendations below to keep your fall planter edible and low-maintenance.

The best places to find organically grown plant starters to fill your planter would be local nurseries and farmers' markets.

### STEP THREE: Assemble Your Fall Planter

Follow these tips as you're adding plants to your planter.

**Tip 1:** Use a gardening tool that's long and narrow so that you can dig deep to make a new planting hole without disturbing the other plants in the container.

**Tip 2:** Remove each plant from its pot gently and use your fingers to loosen the roots a bit. Plants from the store have often been left in their pots for a little too long.

**Tip 3:** Make sure to dig a nice, deep hole for each plant so that you can bury the entire root ball. You want the neck of each plant (where the roots meet the stem) to be right on level with the soil.



### Edible Planter Plant List

- Chives
- Dill
- Lemon Thyme
- Oregano
- Parsley
- Sage
- Swiss chard
- Spinach
- Red Leaf Lettuce
- Rosemary

*Transform ratatouille into a bake with a layer of cheese sauce and you won't look back. It makes a great late summer dish.*

## Baked Ratatouille & Goat Cheese

### INGREDIENTS:

- 4 tbsp olive oil
- 2 red onions, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 2 eggplants, diced
- 2 red peppers, seeded and diced
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1 tsp soy sauce
- 16 oz tomato purée
- 7 oz goat cheese
- 4 zucchini (a mixture of green and yellow looks nice), thinly sliced

### FOR THE CHEESE SAUCE

- 14 oz milk
- 2 oz unsalted butter
- 2 oz plain flour
- 3 oz parmesan cheese

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Heat 1 tbsp olive oil in a heavy frying pan and gently cook the red onion and garlic for 5 mins until just starting to brown. Scatter over the eggplant and red pepper and sizzle for another 4 mins, adding more oil if needed. Season well and stir through the paprika, then splash in the vinegar and



soy sauce. Pour over the tomato purée, then simmer for 5 mins until glossy and thick. Turn off the heat. Can be made up to two days ahead and kept in the fridge.

2. To make the cheese sauce, heat the milk in a heavy saucepan until simmering. In a separate pan, melt the butter and add the flour. Stir to make a paste. Slowly whisk in the hot milk and simmer gently for 2-3 mins, stirring continually until thickened slightly. Stir in the parmesan and season.
3. Pour the ratatouille into an ovenproof dish, then completely cover it with the cheese sauce. Crumble over the goat cheese and arrange the zucchini slices on top in concentric circles, alternating between green and yellow if you have them. Can be assembled several hours before cooking.
4. Heat oven to 400°. Brush or drizzle the remaining oil over the zucchini slices and season with sea salt. Bake in the oven for 25-30 mins until the zucchini are cooked through and starting to brown. Remove from the oven and allow to rest for 20 mins before serving.

### **EH SCHOOLS CALL ON NEIGHBORS TO HELP SAFEGUARD KIDS**

On June 26, EHHS hosted a Community Safety Meeting. More than 40 people attended, including neighbors, FWISD Trustee Tobi Jackson, City Council Rep Jeanette Martinez, and a team of police liaisons who work with our schools.

Principal Tremayna Thomas spoke about the importance of the partnership between schools, police, and neighborhoods.

Attendance at EHHS is approximately 1300 students, and while EHHS administrators have in place a system for monitoring students' location during the school day, using teachers and police posted at doors and outside during entry and exit times, Principal Thomas said EHHS would benefit from neighbors' eyes and ears. She and the EHHS Police Liaison David Sullivan urged neighbors to report any unusual activity, particularly if students are seen lingering outside during times when they should be inside.

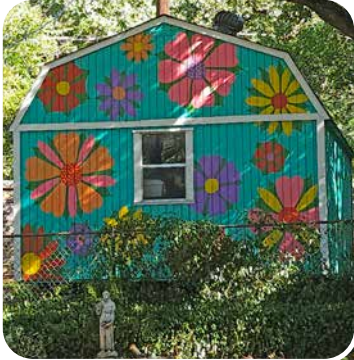

## Criminal Justice Program:

Fort Worth ISD is piloting a new Criminal Justice Program with FW Police. Two dozen selected students from Eastern Hills and South Hills High Schools are participating in the pilot. The program aims to expose students to the fundamentals of law enforcement and to foster trust within the communities FWPD serves. Students attend classes twice a week and learn the same content taught by the police academy. Program leaders are working to get kids excited about opportunities in law enforcement, create more home-grown members of the FWPD, and help close the employment gap.

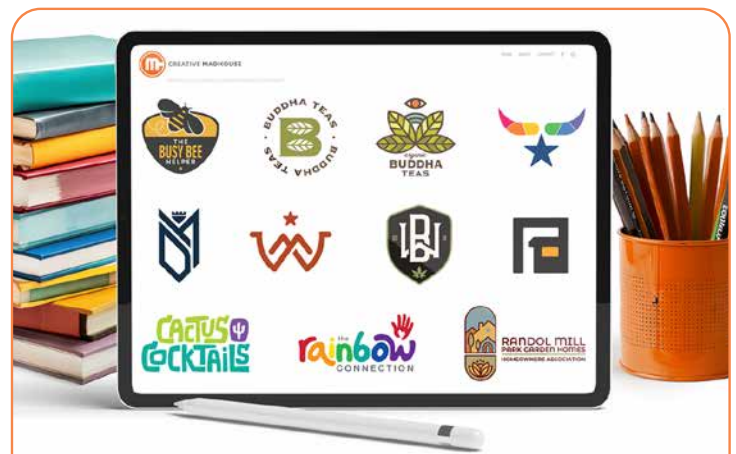
