

Their role involves identifying anything unusual that may require attention, as well as disseminating information and coordinating events for the residents on their block.

Eastside Info

Information from a recent meeting of the Neighborhood Alliance

Holiday Photos with Santa: December 2, 1-4 pm the Handley Neighborhood Association is hosting Holiday Photos with Santa at the Caboose. Children and good dogs are welcome.

Express Bus to Alliance: Trinity Metro continues to work on plans for an express bus that would originate at the transfer station near Oakland, with one stop downtown, and then straight to the Alliance area. Charles Edmonds, who serves on the Trinity Metro board, does not know the timeline for this service; however, it would provide a viable way for residents in this area who would like to pursue the well-paying jobs at the Alliance Inland Port with a reliable and convenient way to travel back and forth for work. Hopefully there will be an opportunity for jobs fair over here to help inform residents of the employment opportunities this express bus will open up to them.

Gateway Park: A meeting was held November 6 at the Victory Forest Community Center on the south side. Approximately 50-60 people attended, representing general interest and advocacy for the park, but those interested in disc golf, mountain biking, and skateboarding were also well-represented, among others. There were a lot of people interested in knowing more about the amphitheater potential, which is shown on the plans. Several spoke about its small size and lack of power/ sound because it will sit in the floodplain. This seemed to be a key element that needs more refining. Several spoke about the importance

of using the park to generate economic growth for the area.

Of the \$8M bond money, about \$5.5-\$6M will go for improvements, with the rest being what the park people called "soft costs" (consultant fee, etc). The remainder will probably largely go for infrastructure improvements, primarily on the portion not currently open to the public (west of Beach Street). The total master plan is estimated to cost \$140M to implement. This means many of the elements in the draft plan will not be seen until more bond money is allocated in the years ahead. Park Director Richard Zavala said he will be asking for \$20M to \$25M for the park in a potential 2026 bond election.

Public Transit and Arlington: The proposed high-speed rail between Fort Worth and Dallas will be stopping in the Arlington entertainment district. The fact that these passengers will then need transit to reach their final destinations could become a catalyst for public transit to finally become a reality in Arlington. Again, this is a long way off, but there could eventually be hope for public transit for the many people -- especially UTA students -- who would benefit from it.
